Donna became interested in politics at the age of nine when a local candidate for office in New Orleans promised to build a neighborhood playground. As a Fellow at the Institute of Politics at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government, she worked for several advocacy groups in Washington, DC, & was instrumental in the successful campaign to make Martin Luther King Jr's birthday a federal holiday. After Hurricane Katrina disaster, Brazile was appointed as a member of the Board of Directors of the Louisiana Recovery Authority. On the fun side, Donna finds time

to be a member of the Screen Actors Guild (SAG), starring in several movies. You will be learn & be entertained.
