NECA GCDF Trainees and Instructors Mario Luk and Ron Tang from Hong Kong met with Dr. Kay Brawley, NECA Director of Professional Affairs and John Hakemian, NECA Executive Director recently in Hong Kong to discuss future collaboration and marketing proposals for NECA. While the dialogue was very positive, Brawley had the opportunity to briefly discuss the issue of escalating protests of Hong Kong regarding the China authoritarian government's attempt to take away freedoms that Hong Kong people have enjoyed. Hopefully, China will choose to honor its promise of autonomy for Hong Kong through 2047. It's crisis time--Hong Kong needs the support of the world, especially the US. Most recently the US House passed the Hong Kong Human Rights and Democracy Act, and the Senate is expected to follow through as well. This is a step in the right direction.

NECA members Judy Daniels, Sue Pressman, and Seneka Arrington attended the Association for Counselor Education and Supervision (ACES) conference in Seattle, WA, October 2019

FROM PAST NECA PRESIDENT DR. GREY EDWARDS



FROM THE NEWS EDITOR



This month was Veteran's Day and I was fortunate to attend celebratory functions. Women have always wanted to help this great nation in the same vein as their fathers, brothers, and husbands. They began serving as wash women and tending to wounds in the Continental Army and Civil War and were allowed to enlist as nurses and secretaries in WWI. An unprecedented need for soldiers emerged during WWII and women filled in the gaps in non-combat positions such as linguists, weather forecasters, and telephone operators.

Women were hired through the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps, but with advocacy from Rep. Edith Nourse Rogers, women were allowed to enlist in Army reserves and eventually in the Army itself. It was the creation of the women's Army Corps that women attained military rank and served overseas as well. With a record number of women enlisting in military branches such as WAVES (US Navy) and SPARS (US Coast Guard) they came to achieve great heights.

In 2013, women achieved full status in all the military branches when they were granted the right to serve in front lines in ground combat.

As for me, I am extremely proud to be a Navy wife. When our husbands serve, we do too.


